**AMENDMENT TO ANN ARBOR CHARTER TOWNSHIP
CODE OF ORDINANCES
ADDING NEW ARTICLE IV TO CHAPTER 14
BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS**

Amendment to Ann Arbor Charter Township Code of Ordinances adopted at a regular meeting of the Ann Arbor Charter Township Board of Trustees held on September 22, 2008 at 3792 Pontiac Trail, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48105.

The Ann Arbor Charter Township Board of Trustees ordains that Chapter 14 of the Ann Arbor Charter Township Code of Ordinances pertaining to Buildings and Building Regulations is amended to add the following new Article IV pertaining to Building Numbering.

CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE IV. BUILDING NUMBERING

Section 14-100. Purpose and intent of article.

It is the purpose of this article to provide for the legible marking and rapid identification of dwellings, buildings, and structures by numbers and to assist police, fire, ambulance, and other services in the event of an emergency.

Section 14-101. Duty.

Each owner or occupant of a dwelling, building, or structure located in the Township shall display and maintain a street address assigned by the Township in accordance with the provisions of this article.

Section 14-102. Arabic Numbers.

The street address shall be displayed in Arabic numerals. A street address displayed in letters, script, or roman numerals is prohibited.

Section 14-103. Size and color.

The Arabic numerals shall not be less than three inches in height and shall be of such a color as to contrast with the immediate background on which they are mounted.

Section 14-104. Location of street address.

The street address shall be conspicuously displayed on the principal dwelling, building, or structure on the premises and shall be, insofar as possible, clearly and readily visible from a roadway, street, or highway abutting the premises. The street address shall be affixed to an additional fixture on the premises when the street address affixed to the principal dwelling, building, or structure is not clearly or readily visible from a roadway, street, or highway abutting the premises. Such additional street address may be affixed to a mail receptacle which is clearly and readily visible from a roadway, street, or highway abutting the premises, provided the mail receptacle is on the premises to which the street address is assigned, the Arabic numerals are placed on both sides of the mail receptacle, are not less than three inches in height, and contrast with the immediate background on which they are mounted.
